MESSAGE FROM THE GOOGONG PROJECT DIRECTOR MALCOLM LESLIE

Development at Googong has been proceeding apace over the past few months. Subdivision Stages 3A (60 lots) and 3B1 (105 lots) were completed and registered in November 14 and February 15 respectively. Subdivision Stage 4A (56 lots) work has been completed and registration is pending Council approval.

This brings the total number of completed blocks in Googong North to 558 and works are underway on a further 495 lots in Stages 3B2, 4B, 5A, 5B, 6A and 6D.

A subdivision DA for a further 610 lots in Googong North and Montgomery Rise is pending approval and designs are underway to enable the first sales release in this area in May with subdivision construction commencing around July.

Work is proceeding well on the first Stage of the townships Water Recycling Plant. The Contractor, John Holland, has all but completed the detailed design and has completed some of the critical structures of the plant. It is anticipated the plant will be treating wastewater from occupied homes by September.

Beltana Park has bounced back well from the popular Googfest activities. Despite a relatively dry month the grass, trees and gardens of the park are doing well thanks to the irrigation system and the continued maintenance.

The repairs and establishment of the lower section of Beltana Park around Beltana Pond are almost complete. As

part of our commitment to protecting the wider environment we continue to use Beltana Pond as a sediment control basin during the construction of homes in the pond catchment area. This means during heavy and constant storm events the pond periodically floods.

Rockley Oval is now open to the public and has welcomed the first users of the oval playing surface over the last month. This has included an informal but well organised cricket match of local residents as a "curtain raiser" to Googfest and the registration day for Queanbeyan Tigers Junior AFL club where stars from the GWS Giants came to support the Tigers. Winter will see Rockley Oval used as the home of the Harman Hogs and Queanbeyan Tigers Juniors AFL clubs.

For residents and visitors the next major park and play ground on John Caragh Drive is almost complete. John Caragh Park provides a different play experience

for residents and visitors as the park has retained significant vegetation and its main feature is the extensive path system for walking, running, bikes and scooters. Added to this are BBQ facilities and a striking birds nest swing on top of the hill. We hope to have this park open by the end of April.

Preliminary plans for the Googong North Village Centre have been prepared and will hopefully be locked in within the next few months following further negotiations with key commercial operators and discussions with Council.

Designs for an upgrade to the intersection of Googong Road with Old Cooma Road have been prepared and approved by Council. Work is anticipated to commence shortly. There have been reports of a number of near misses at the intersection and residents are encouraged to take extra care when using the intersection especially since the speed limit on Old Cooma Road is currently 100km/hr.

There is considerable on-street parking around some of the home building sites during construction, which can also obstruct line-of-sight. Builders are accessing these vehicles frequently during the day and there has been concern about

the speed of passing traffic along Beltana Avenue (in particular) over recent weeks. While the speed on Beltana Avenue is officially 50km/hour, it would be appreciated if you could slow to 40km to protect the safety of these workers and the community.
